

Activities for after the classroom visit for *Grandpa's White Cane*.

1. Write a thank you note to the speakers and to the Lions Club members if they provided books.
2. Using the Braille book mark, write your name using Braille characters.
3. Role play the Do's and Don't's from the *Grandpa's White Cane* book – sidebars and informational list in the back of the book.
4. With your eyes closed, make a peanut butter and jelly sandwich.
5. Draw a picture of a person on the bike path meeting a blind person. What do you do and say as you pass that person?
6. Draw a picture of a person with a tall white cane. Write what the tall white cane means.
7. Write the dialogue of how a sighted person would greet a blind person.
8. Make a word search to include: blind, braille, low vision, visibility, confidence, white cane
9. Write a poem about a tall white cane and the person using the cane. Poetry can include all forms of formula poetry including Acrostic Poetry, Haiku, Tanka Poems, Free Verse, Diamante Poems, Synonym Poems, Cinquain Poems, Object Poems.
10. Role play common home activities: fixing breakfast, setting the table, making the bed, doing laundry.
11. Write the dialogue describing to a blind person where the food is located on the plate or tray.
12. Design a playground for blind children: include a swing set, walking path, hand-over-hand overhead ladder, jump ropes, hula hoops. What other recreational equipment would you include?
13. In vocal and instrumental music classes, what accommodations would you need to make for the blind?
14. List five of your favorite games. How would blind individuals be able to participate in the games? Do you have to make any changes to the games?
15. Consider the blind person's challenge with making a mosaic tile with multiple colors. What might be a solution to enhance the accuracy of the tile pattern?
16. List five of your favorite carnival rides. How might these rides be described to a blind person?
